Vision: Stronger Fathers, Healthier Communities

Mission: To give fathers hope by walking together in supportive community, helping navigate relational and legal barriers which separate them from their children and families.

D.A.D.S. Services

- **Child Support Management**

D.A.D.S. offers guidance and assistance to fathers who are currently experiencing child support obligations that exceed their ability to pay. D.A.D.S. works with fathers and with the Office of Support Enforcement to obtain a realistic child support plan.

- **Parent Involvement**

D.A.D.S. works with men to understand their importance in the lives of their children. This may take the form of helping to get visitation or to create parenting plans to submit to the courts. D.A.D.S. helps encourage men to become positive role models for their children.

- **Reunification**

With the assistance of consultants and other agencies, D.A.D.S. will help locate and reunite fathers with their children and families, within the legal limit of the law.

- **Training for Fathers**

D.A.D.S. offers training to men, using the curriculum called "Quenching the Father Thirst." The 13-week class is geared towards urban fathers. It helps men to become effective communicators with their children and family. The class provides listening skills, techniques in getting to know your children, and a structure for setting goals around improving relationships.

- **Support Groups**

D.A.D.S. offers a [support group](#) that allows fathers to reconfirm their commitment to their families. Fathers can discuss the problems and struggles they may be experiencing in trying to accomplish their action plan.

- **Case Management**

D.A.D.S. provides a one-on-one case advocacy program for anyone who is in need of family services. This includes time-limited assistance with gaining housing, legal assistance and family stability.

TABLE CAPTAIN/TABLE SPONSOR DAY-OF INSTRUCTIONS

Thank you for serving as a D.A.D.S. Banquet Sponsor, Table Sponsor, or Table Captain!

We thank you for being a host at this year's annual fatherhood banquet—creating stronger fathers, healthier communities. We are expecting a great group for this event, including many who already know us—and some who will be hearing about D.A.D.S.' work for the first time.

What are the different roles?

A banquet sponsor provides financial support for the banquet and receives marketing visibility and a full table for the event.

A table sponsor reserves a full table for the event and makes a commitment to invite enough guests to fill the table of 10. Some table sponsors reserve two tables—and invite 19 guests!

A table captain invites others to the banquet and acts as a table host. The table captain is under no obligation to purchase the table or others' tickets. The process is the same as a cultivation event: invite people you feel will support the organization's mission, and who will be moved by seeing the results of the mission in action at the banquet. What are my responsibilities as a Table Captain during the banquet?

We would like you to be available to host your table guests during dinner. We will provide pledge cards and pens for the solicitation (“the ask”). Please collect the pledge cards from your guests and turn them into the treasurer at the registration table after the banquet.

Some Hosting Tips:

- Registration will be available from 6:00 p.m.-6:30 p.m. When your guests check in they will be given your table number. (The registration table will be able to accept payment from your guests on the night of if they haven't already submitted payment.)
- Please greet your table guests and introduce everyone at your table.
- Please plan to stay until the end of the event and collect the pledge cards from your guests, then turn them into the treasurer at the registration table after the banquet.

We will be in contact with each table captain following the event in order to discuss next steps with guests who are likely to become supporters or friends or who might require additional information about D.A.D.S. Also, you are welcome to jot recommendations for follow up with your guests on the back of this form and turn it in with your table captain packet at the end of the evening or to send an email to marvinpastor@msn.com.

Driving to SSCC via the Michigan-Corson Exit (off I-5, North or Southbound)

- Michigan-Corson Exit (#162)
- Right onto S. Michigan St.
- Follow Michigan to 1st Ave. Bridge, taking ramp onto bridge.
- Take FIRST exit (W. Marginal Way/South Park).
- Right at the end of ramp; left at signal.
- Left at Highland Park Way (up the hill).
- Take first right turn onto Holden, continuing to 16th Ave.
- Right onto 16th Ave., follow north one mile to SSCC campus on your right.

Enter campus via south entrance. Free parking is available for visitors in front of the Robert Smith Building which is adjacent to the Jerry M. Brockey Center.
