Becoming Dads Parenting Classes Update



Teaching fathers how to put their children first pays off

Caleb recently wrote

.... as a teenager I was causing so much trouble that my dad sent me to 2 youth behavior ranches, 1 in Prescott, Wa. The other in Geneva , New York. When I got a home visit I stole my dad's van and ended up in juvenile hall. As I turned 17, I ended up going to prison and being charged as an adult... In total I have spent over 10 years incarcerated. I met my oldest daughter's mom before I went to prison the last time. I saw my daughter for the first time in 2020 and she was 14.

I had a friend of mine tell me about the DADS program. That is where I met pastor Larry brooks and Greg Adams. I completed the parenting class and that helped me learn what it's like to be a parent. And it helped me navigate through the trials and tribulations. After going through this class, I had a whole new outlook on trying to be a co-parent and **put the kids first instead of always battling** with the other parent.

Losing my kids and getting clean and sober around the same time was extremely difficult. Through this whole new transition. I have stayed in contact with pastor Larry and have kept him in the loop with what is going on with my family court.

My life has been crazy at times lots of heart ache and happiness. Times where I wanted to throw in the towel and give up. But today I can say **"I am super grateful for the life I live with my wife and my kids and the home that we share. And no matter what everything will be ok"**.
